Universities Findings : on “Non-registration of FIRs



Registrars Meeting on 4/5/07

- One needs influential person to get one's FIR registered.
- Attempts are made to arrive at a compromise even in serious criminal offences for extraneous reasons.
- Non-registration is worse in rural police stations.
- About 10% of the cases investigated are the result of court intervention.
- NGOs participation required to rectify .

A V.I. course is planned on Image Building & Behaviour Pattern of Police from 23rd to 27th July, 2007 at Administrative Staff College, Hyderabad.

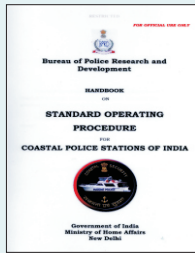
2ND ALL INDIA PRISON DUTY MEET ORGANISED BY BPR&D

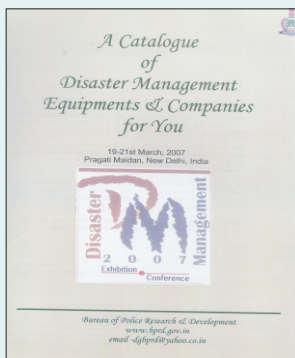
