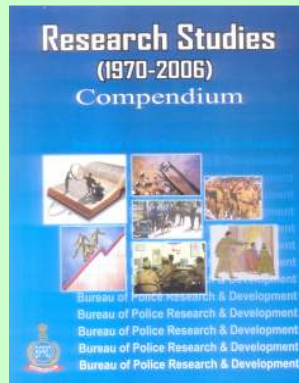

RESEARCH

Compendium of Research Studies (1970 – 2006)

Meeting of the Sub-group of Standing Committee on Police Research

The Sub-group of Standing Committee on Police Research met on 20th November 2006. This Sub-group has approved the following **7 research studies** to be undertaken after the approval of Ministry of Home Affairs.

- i. A study on reporting behaviour of victims of crime in the state of Tamil Nadu: Towards Dynamic Police-Public Interface;
- ii. Witness in the Criminal Justice Process (A Study of Hostility and Problems associated with witness);
- iii. Impact of occupational health on the performance of Chennai city Traffic Police;
- iv. Modalities for compensation to the victims of Crime;
- v. Local self Governance and policing;
- vi. Social Impact of Police in the administration of Justice in Manipur (A study in Police Public Interface in Imphal, District Manipur) and
- vii. Analysis of the case laws and to collate rulings useful for field officers.

CORRECTIONAL/PRISON ADMINISTRATION

5th Meeting of the Advisory Committee on Prison Reform

The meeting of the newly constituted **Advisory Committee of the BPR&D on Prison Reform** was held on 3rd November 2006 at New Delhi. The meeting was presided over by Dr. Kiran Bedi, DG, BPR&D and Chairman of the Committee.

Thirty-three participants including 16 members of the Advisory Committee from various States/UTs attended the meeting. Thirty-seven agenda points were discussed and appropriate decisions were taken. Some new initiatives identified by the BPR&D like, the **preparation of the audio-visual aids in correctional administration** and **proposal for under taking research projects on ten identified topics** under sponsorship programmes of the BPR&D were approved by the committee. The committee also approved the proposal of the BPR&D for organizing *seeing is learning (SIL)* and *Training of Trainers (TOT)* Programmes for Prison Officers in addition to Vertical Interaction Course and Human Rights courses being organized by the BPR&D every year.

Seeing is Learning Training Programmes for Prison Officers.

One of the training programmes for Prison Officers of middle supervisory levels was organized by the BPR&D in collaboration with Central Prison, Amritsar on the newly devised module "*seeing is Learning*" (*SIL*) on 8th and 9th November, 2006 at Central Prison, Amritsar. Prison Officers of the rank of Assistant Superintendent/Deputy Jailor to Superintendents of Prisons actively participated in this programme with their professional enthusiasm. The participative technique was used for conducting these programmes.

Dr. B. V. Trivedi, Assistant Director, BPR&D and coordinator of this specialized programme made a presentation on **Prison Reforms in India : An Overview**

Dr. Kiran Bedi, DG, BPR&D addressed the participants during valedictory session held on 9th November, 2006 and taken the final feedback from the participants of this specialized programme. It was a great morale boosting for all the participants to initiate reforms in their respective prisons, illuminating a ray of hope for the inmates as a successful Prison Manager. The feedback received from the participants is found to be quite encouraging.

ASIAN PACIFIC CONFERENCE OF CORRECTIONAL ADMINISTRATORS

XXVI ASIAN PACIFIC CONFERENCE OF CORRECTIONAL ADMINISTRATORS (APCCA) was held from 26th November 2006 to 2nd December 2006 at Auckland (New Zealand). The Indian

delegation comprising of 9 Prison Officials attended the conference and presented a country paper on **National Report on Contemporary issues in Corrections in India**, prepared by the BPR&D in consultation with the members of Indian delegation. Members of the delegation also participated in various workshops and made their presentations during this conference.

NEW EVENTS

Ludhiana District Police gets ISO 9001:2000

Ludhiana District Police has become one of the Police Force in the country to attain the ISO 9001:2000 certificate for the Community Policing Resource Centre (CPRC), popularly known as the **single window system**. Technical Universal and Verifiable (TUV) of Germany issued this certificate. Under the ISO certificate, a quality policy has been framed where the CPRC resolved to give people efficient, law abiding and responsive law enforcement machinery.

It would strive to improve the quality of policing through easy and dignified access of the public to Police Services, improve Community-Police relations, maintain transparency in service and provide a forum to address rights of all citizens and sections of the community.

The single window system has established a management system for general enquiries, verifications regarding passports, National Crime Research Bureau vehicle verification etc. Under its wing, it has visa extension, permissions, and NRI registrations, human rights complaints and an Information Cell under the Right to Information Act.

Information Technology & Telecom Training Centre

The Hon'ble Union Home Minister Shri Shivraj V. Patil has inaugurated the SSB Information Technology & Telecom Training Centre and Museum on 10.11.2006.

Mission:

- i) Computerization up to the level of Border Outposts;
- ii) Connectivity by Wide and Local Area Networks among field units;

- iii) Video conferencing capability with field formations and training centres and
- iv) Modern gadgets and devices including Global Positioning System, VSAT, SMART equipments, Geographical Information System, Satellite Phones, Mobile Communication Units etc.

Objectives

- a) Enable the workforce for effective use of modern gadgets;
- b) Equip the force to create an Intelligence & Surveillance structure for real time data collection, accurate information analysis for effective intervention;
- c) Capacity building of the organization in use of Information Technology as force enhancer for mobility, responsiveness, and operations and
- d) Enhance effectiveness of the Civic Action Programmes like Medical Camps, Veterinary Camps etc. by improved service delivery using Management Information System and Data Base Management System.
