Micro-Missions

In pursuance of decision taken by the Ministry of Home Affairs of constituting six micro missions — HRD, community Policing, Communication & Technology, Infrastructure, New processes and Proactive Policing and visualizing future challenges—BPR&D is working on to implement the projects under these micro missions. The progress made on these missions during Nov-Dec. 2009:

Human Resource Development:

The project on "Transparent Recruitment Process" is being taken up by MHA which is persuading all State DGs to implement and BPR&D to monitor it.

The Community Policing:

Under this mission FICCI will set up five pilot projects and a MoU between FICCI, MHA and the States is to be signed. Another Soft Skills Project has also been finalized for training at Delhi and Punjab.

India re- elected as member to APCCA Governing Board

The 29th Asian and Pacific Conference of Correctional Administrators (APCCA) was held at Perth, Australia from 15th to 20th November, 2009 to discuss various aspects of correctional administration and prisons while fostering cooperation in the Asian and Pacific Regions. A number of delegates from 31 member countries and other members from no-state organizations like UNAFEI and UNODC attended the Conference. India was again elected as member to the APCCA Governing Body. The Conference was formally inaugurated on 16th November 2009 and heads of the participating countries presented their papers on "Contemporary Issues in Corrections". A 11 members delegation from India led by DG, BPR&D attended the Conference. The country paper for India was presented by Sh. Prasun Mukherjee, DG, BPR&D. Later on 17th November, 2009 the delegates divided in three groups and each group had discussions on different topics. Shri Neeraj kansal, Director (CS), MHA, Govt. of India and Shri T. Suneel Kumar, Secretary (Home), Karnataka represented India in the session and discussed topic: "Prison Employment as a mechanism to Promote Good Order in Prisons and to Reduce Recidivism." Shri Neeraj Kansal, Director (CS), MHA, Govt. of India made a presentation on the subject

emphasizing the employment opportunities and vocational training for prisoners with special reference to Tihar prison. Three Specialist workshops covering various aspects of correctional administration were also held in the Conference. Shri T. Suneel Kumar, Secretary (Home), Karnataka participated in one of the Specialist Workshop on "Engaging with other Criminal Justice System Agencies (including Police, Judges and Policy Makers) to Achieve consistency of Goals" held on 18th Nov. 2009. India was also been elected as a member of the Agenda Committee of APCCA which finalizes the main agenda points for the next Conference. The Governing Body of APCCA decided to hold the next Conference at Vancouver, Canada from 3rd to 8th October.

3-D X-ray scanning Machine

A Presentation by Cast masters-x-ray systems was held on 08/12/09 at BPR&D, Hgrs. New Delhi. The officers from CPMFs were among those who attend the meeting. The company is marketing x-ray machine manufactured by 3DX-RAY Ltd of UK. The machine can be used for scanning of baggage at strategic llocations so as to prohibit the entry of suspect material. The image quality and image enhancement techniques are very sophisticated and lead to a 3D view of the scanned object. The advantage of the equipment is its mobility, easy installation, large detection area, high-resolution and 2D & 3D scan of the object. The machine can be deployed for EOD evaluation of suspicious packages, material discrimination, hidden weapons in vehicles and similar usage.

Automatic Number Plate Recognition Device



M/S Jubliant ENPRO made a presentation on the Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) on 17/12/09 at BPR&D Hgrs. The ANPR is a surveillance device that uses optical character recognition on images to read the number plates on vehicles in any format. It can be used for monitoring traffic activity as well as for tracking lost vehicles and other unlawful activities. The system is good and can be used by the police for the purpose of recovery of stolen vehicle, highway monitoring, border control

and disrupting crime or terrorism. The system can be deployed in fixed or patrolling mode.

Patrol Support System


Territorial Monitoring and Control Patrol Support System (PSS II) is a multi-function, handheld device that draws or biometric technology to support territorial monitoring and control operations. It can be used for biometric identification, reading electronic identity documents, geographical positioning, data and voice connectivity, optical character recognition and Image/audio capturing.
